DAY
1

DAY 1: WELCOME TO FINLAND

When you arrive at **Helsinki** Airport, make your way to city centre. Many travellers opt to take public transportation, but we also offer direct private transfers. Take advantage of this first day on your own to discover this Nordic gem at your own pace, and eat at one of the many delicious restaurants. We recommend visiting **Senate Square**, **Uspenski Cathedral**, and the **Old Market Hall** to become acquainted with Finnish history and culture.

Spend the night in Helsinki.

Attractions: Finland, Helsinki, Old Market Hall, Senate Square, Uspenski Cathedral

DAY
2

DAY 2: EXPLORE LOVELY HELSINKI

Today, continue exploring Helsinki before boarding a cruise to Sweden. Helsinki is known for its creativity and, in 2012, was awarded the UNESCO “City of Design” title, boasting its very own design district and “design tram route” (Line 6). Some notable city landmarks to see or visit include **Sibelius Park**, **Finlandia Hall**, the **Finnish National Opera House**, and **Parliament House**, the seat of Parliament in Finland.

Spend the night in Helsinki.

Attractions: Finlandia Hall, Finnish Parliament Building, Helsinki Opera House, Sibelius Monument

DAY
3

DAY 3: SAIL TO ELEGANT ESTONIA

This morning you will head to the ferry terminal in Helsinki for a 2-hour ferry ride to **Tallinn**, the capital of Estonia. After checking in at your centrally-located hotel, you can explore this beautiful medieval city as you wish. We recommend a walk from the **Upper Town (Toompea)** and a visit to the Orthodox **St. Alexander Nevsky Cathedral**, the ancient limestone walls of the medieval **Toompea Castle**, the current seat of the Estonian Parliament. For dinner, you will find many nice restaurants in the **Old Town (Vanalinn)**.

Spend the night in Tallinn.

Attractions: Alexander Nevsky Cathedral, Estonia, Old Town (Vanalinn), Tallinn, Toompea (Tallinn Upper Town)

DAY

4

DAY 4: OPEN DAY IN TALLINN

Today you will continue to discover enchanting Estonia. Tallinn has a lot to offer and we highly recommend a visit to the **Kalamaja** district where you will find shops, cafes, interesting architecture and museums, including the Seaplane Harbour, a maritime museum. You could also stop by **Telliskivi** for a meal and a visit to a gallery or two. A visit to **Port Noblessner** is also recommended, where you can walk along the marina and grab a bite to eat at a café.

Spend the night in Tallinn.

Attractions: Kalamaja, Noblessner, Telliskivi

5

DAY 5: TALLINN & OVERNIGHT FERRY TO SWEDEN

Spend the morning continuing your exploration of the Estonian capital. Like most European cities with an 800-year history, **Tallinn** is a patchwork of historic areas, offering a fascinating blend of Eastern and Western European influences. For a blast from the past, take a stroll through the **Kadriorg district**, reminiscent of a time when Estonia was ruled by Russian tsars. This area houses several interesting sights, such as the **Kadriorg Palace** and the **Estonian Art Museum**. You could also visit the newer parts of Tallinn, such as **Freedom square** (Vabaduse väljak), to get a glimpse of Soviet-era life.

In the late afternoon, you will board an overnight cruise to Stockholm.

Spend the night on the cruise ship.

Attractions: Art Museum of Estonia, Freedom Square, Kadriorg, Kadriorg Palace

DAY

6

DAY 6: WELCOME TO STOCKHOLM

Savour the maritime scenery during breakfast as the ship navigates through Sweden's Archipelago, a collection of over 30,000 islands and inlets. Upon your arrival in **Stockholm**, make your way to the hotel and then enjoy some time exploring the city centre. We recommend, enjoying some shopping on the well-known pedestrian street **Drottninggatan** and taking a stroll in the surrounding area of **Östermalm**. There you will find numerous shops, cafés, and restaurants for a perfect introduction to Swedish culture.

Spend the night in Stockholm.

Attractions: Drottninggatan, Stockholm, Sweden, Östermalm

DAY

7

DAY 7: THE CHARMS OF SWEDISH CULTURE

Today you will explore the heart of scenic Stockholm. We recommend exploring the capital by foot, visiting attractions such as the **Old Town (Gamla Stan)**, where you will find the **Royal Palace**, the parliament, old churches, beautiful cobble stone streets and medieval houses.

After some time at Gamla Stan, you can take a short ferry ride to the nearby island **Djurgården**, a cultural oasis with something for everyone. Here you will find the kitschy **Abba Museum**, the **Nordic Museum**, the **Gröna Lund** amusement park, and the **Skansen** open-air museum. It is ideal to spend the afternoon here, exploring the grounds and many attractions.

Spend the night in Stockholm.

Attractions: ABBA The Museum, Djurgården, Gamla Stan (Old town of Stockholm), Gröna Lund amusement park, Royal Palace of Stockholm, Stockholm City Hall, Södermalm

DAY

8

DAY 8: TRAVEL FROM STOCKHOLM TO LOVELY COPENHAGEN

Today you will take a short flight to **Copenhagen**. After settling in at your hotel, go for a walk along the enchanting old harbour area of **Nyhavn**, where you will see colourful houses and lively restaurants among the docked boats. Walk the narrow side streets, visit some shops and try out the traditional Danish open-faced sandwich, Smørrebrød. In the evening, visit the amusement park **Tivoli Gardens**, which has something for everyone. It's a lovely place to admire the architecture and gardens and to enjoy some carnival rides.

Spend the night in Copenhagen.

DAY

9

DAY 9: A DAY IN CAPTIVATING COPENHAGEN

You have the whole day to explore **Copenhagen**. We recommend seeing the city by foot, visiting landmarks like **Amalienborg Palace**, **Christiansborg Palace**, and the famous **Little Mermaid** statue. An optional cruise from the harbour is also highly recommended as you can appreciate the architecture and beauty of the city by water. Next, stroll **Strøget** street for some shopping and grab something to eat at Torvehallerne food hall.

Spend the night in Copenhagen.

Attractions: Amalienborg Palace, Christiansborg Palace, Little Mermaid, Nyhavn, Strøget shopping street

DAY
10

DAY 10: SET SAIL FOR NORWAY

Spend the morning touring Copenhagen. Some interesting attractions include the observatory of **The Round Tower**, the most famous church in Copenhagen, **Church of Our Saviour**, as well as the impeccable King's Garden, and the regal **Rosenborg Castle**. In the early afternoon, it's time to board your cruise to Oslo, which sails gently up the **Kattegat Sund** on its way to Norway's capital city. You can enjoy dinner in one of the restaurants, check out the entertainment on board or just relax and watch the sunset from the deck.

Spend the night on board the DFDS cruise, in a private cabin.

Attractions: Church of Our Saviour, Kattegat Sund, Rosenborg Castle, The Round Tower

DAY
11

DAY 11: EXPLORE ENCHANTING OSLO

After the cruise ship docks, get ready to see the best of Oslo. The city is quite walkable and recommend exploring by foot and the convenience of public transport. You could visit the Fram Polar Ship Museum and spend some time along the beautiful harbour area. Other highlights include the beautiful Vigeland Sculpture Park, the Royal Palace, Akershus fortress, Oslo City Hall, and Karl Johans street.

Spend the night in Oslo.

Attractions: Aker Brygge, Akershus Fortress, Munch Museum, Norway, Oslo, Oslo Opera House

DAY
12

DAY 12: RAILWAY JOURNEY TO TRONDHEIM

This morning you will head to Oslo Central Station to board the half-day (6.5-hour) journey aboard the Dovrebanen train. The train route passes over the **Dovre mountain** plateau through historic towns and nature preserves and includes great variations of scenery. The journey concludes with a steep, curvy descent to **Trondheim**.

Spend the afternoon discovering Trondheim, including **Bakklandet**, an idyllic neighbourhood full of history and culture, **Nidaros Cathedral**, as well as other attractions such as the Ringve museum and gardens, Munkholmen and the Old town bridge.

Spend the night in Trondheim.

Attractions: Bakklandet, Dovrefjell-Sunndalsfjella National Park, Nidaros Cathedral/Nidarosdomen, Trondheim

DAY
13

DAY 13: EXPLORING THE COASTLINE OF NORWAY

Today, you will embark on a cruise that will have you discovering the maritime beauty of Norway. You will head to the **Trondheim** harbour to board a **Hurtigruten** cruise ship for the Norwegian Coastal Voyage. It will then set sail along the Trondheim Fjord and past Hitra Island.

Later in the evening, the boat will dock at the city of **Kristiansund** and the town of **Molde**. This journey passes through some breathtaking coastal landscapes, and the final port of the day is a brief stop in **Ålesund**, after midnight.

Spend the night on board Hurtigruten.

Attractions: Hurtigruten Coastal Voyage, Kristiansund, Molde

DAY
14

DAY 14: SAIL TO HISTORIC BERGEN

During the night, the ship calls at Torvik, Maløy, and Florø as the journey weaves through islets and stunning landscapes before coming within view of its final destination—**Bergen**. Here you will disembark early in the afternoon to enjoy some leisure time. Despite being an international city, Bergen, “The Capital of the Fjords”, has all the charms of a small town. Here you’ll find **Bryggen**, a UNESCO World Heritage site, along with remarkably preserved old houses, a lively fish and flower market, cable cars offering stunning views, great museums and more.

Spend the night in Bergen.

Attractions: Bergen, Bryggen

DAY
15

DAY 15: THE CAPITAL OF THE FJORDS

Continue to explore beautiful Bergen today. We recommend riding the **Fløibanen Funicular** to Mount Fløyen to enjoy panoramic views over the city or to take a cable car up Ulriken. Bergen is surrounded by 7 mountains so this is an ideal place for hiking. Bergen is also known for its museums that cover the city’s history, architecture, music and art. We recommend visiting the Edvard Grieg museum and the KODE art museum, which is Scandinavia’s largest museum for art and music. If you wish to explore the fjords further, optional fjord cruises are available.

Spend the night in Bergen.

Attractions: Fløibanen Funicular (Funicular Railway), King Håkon’s Hall, Rosenkrantz Tower, St. Mary’s Church

DAY
16

DAY 16: NORWAY IN A NUTSHELL BY LAND AND SEA

Today will be an especially scenic day with a lot of travel. From Bergen, the early Bergensbanen train transports you to Voss, where you'll be transported by bus to **Gudvangen**. There, you will embark on a scenic 2-hour fjord cruise to **Flåm**, including a trip through **Nærøyfjord**, the narrowest fjord in all of Europe. This UNESCO World Heritage site is perhaps the most breathtaking part of Sognefjord, Norway's longest and deepest fjord, with its mighty peaks, tumbling waterfalls, and small farms dotting the mountainsides. Finally, the boat sails up **Aurlandsfjord** to Flåm, a charming village, where you will spend the evening.

Spend the night in Flåm.

We recommend booking luggage transfer for the travel between Bergen and Oslo.

Attractions: Aurlandsfjord, Flåm, Gudvangen, NORWAY IN A NUTSHELL®, Nærøyfjord, Sognefjord

DAY
17

DAY 17: EXPLORE SCENIC FLÅM

Spend the day exploring the beauty of the **Flåm** and its surroundings. There are many well-maintained hiking paths for those who want to explore the beauty of the region by foot. You also get free admission to the Flåm Railway Documentation Centre, where you can learn about the construction of this railway, which has earned the title of one of the world's steepest railway lines. An optional activity to Stegastein viewpoint is recommended. The viewing platform extends about 30 metres from the cliffside and 650 metres above the fjords, offering unbeatable views. For those who want to explore the fjords even further, you can enjoy an optional fjord safari or a kayaking tour.

Spend another night in Flåm.

Attractions: Aurlandsfjord, Fjords in Norway, Flåm, Flåm Railway (Flåmsbana)

DAY
18

DAY 18: THE FLÅM RAILWAY EXPERIENCE

Spend the early part of your day exploring the village of Flåm by following one of the many hiking trails in the mountains around the village. At noon, you'll get to experience the famous **Flåm Railway** as it climbs 900 metres over a span of 20 kilometres up the winding track to the Myrdal Station. Here you will switch to the Bergensbanen train that carries you over the mountainous rooftops of Norway. This ride will take you through the charming villages of Geilo and Gol before concluding in Oslo, where you will spend your last afternoon and night in this amazing country.

Spend the night in Oslo.

Attractions: Flåm, Flåm Railway (Flåmsbana), Geilo, Oslo

DAY

19

DAY 19: BEAUTIFUL OSLO TO IDYLIC ICELAND

This morning, enjoy some last-minute shopping, visit one of Oslo's many museums or relax at a café, before heading to the airport for your flight to Iceland. On arrival to Keflavik International Airport, you will be greeted by a driver who will take you to your accommodation in Reykjavík. After settling in, the rest of the day is free for you to explore. We recommend strolling the streets of the charming capital city, visiting museums, and exploring landmarks like Hallgrímskirkja and the Sun Voyager.

Spend the night in Reykjavik.

Attractions: Iceland, Oslo, Reykjavík

DAY

20

DAY 20: THE CLASSIC GOLDEN CIRCLE

Start the self-drive part of your tour and collect your rental car in the morning. Begin your journey on the classic "Golden Circle" route, home to some of Iceland's most popular attractions. Start with a visit to the fascinating **Pingvellir National Park**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Here, you can walk on a path in the rift valley between the North American and Eurasian tectonic plates. Next on the route is the Haukadalur geothermal area, where you can see **Geysir**—the original "geyser"—and its more active neighbour, Strokkur, which spouts water every few minutes. End the circle with visits to the majestic **Gullfoss** waterfall.

Spend the night in the Hvolsvöllur area.

Driving distance approx. 230 km / 143 mi.

Attractions: Geysir, Gullfoss, Kerið, The Golden Circle, Pingvellir

DAY

21

DAY 21: WATERFALLS & VOLCANIC BEACHES

Head to the fairytale-like **Seljalandsfoss** waterfall, where you can experience walking right behind the misty cascade, and the gorgeous 60-metre high **Skógafoss** waterfall just a short drive down the road. Further ahead at **Vík**, you can make a stop at the black volcanic beach south of the village, from where you can view the rock formations **Dyrhólaey** and **Reynisdrangar**. The last stop of the day is to the stunning **Fjaðrárgljúfur** canyon. You also have a chance today to join an exciting guided excursion by foot or snowmobile on a glacier!

Spend the night in **Kirkjubæjarklaustur/Skaftafell** area.

Driving distance approx. 157 km / 97 mi.

Attractions: Dyrhólaey, Fjaðrárgljúfur, Kirkjubæjarklaustur, Reynisfjara & Reynisdrangar, Seljalandsfoss, Skaftafell, Skógafoss, Vík í Mýrdal

DAY
22

DAY 22: GLACIERS & ICEBERGS

Enjoy **Skaftafell**, part of the immense Vatnajökull National Park and a place of great natural beauty with many interesting hiking trails, including a short path to the beautiful Svartifoss waterfall. This area is also full of opportunities for more adventurous pursuits, such as guided glacier-walking or ice-climbing excursions. Then, head to the amazing **Jökulsárlón Glacier Lagoon**, where you can join a boat ride among the maze of floating icebergs (optional).

Spend the night in the **Höfn** or Djúpvogur area.

Driving distance approx. 208 km / 129 mi.

Attractions: Diamond Beach, Höfn, Jökulsárlón Glacier Lagoon, Skaftafell

DAY
23

DAY 23: FJORDS & FISHING VILLAGES

Your drive along east Iceland today is characterised by spectacular fjords, tranquil fishing villages, rugged tundra and sweeping landscapes. On arrival to the otherworldly Lake Mývatn, you have an abundance of unusual natural wonders to explore, including the **Krafla** volcano, the curiously-coloured **Námaskarð** pass, the massive crater of **Hverfell** and the lunar-like pseudo-craters at Skútustaðir.

Spend the night in the Lake Mývatn area.

Driving distance approx. 430 km / 267 mi.

Attractions: Búlandstindur, Egilsstaðir & Lagarfljót, Hverfjall, Krafla & Leirhnjúkur, Námaskarð, Petra's Stone Collection

DAY
24

DAY 24: LUNAR LANDSCAPES OF LAKE MÝVATN

Use this day to further explore the surroundings of **Lake Mývatn**. You can start the day with an optional whale-watching trip from the village of **Húsavík**, "The Whale Watching Capital of Europe". Then, drive through **Jökulsárgljúfur**; part of Vatnajökull National Park, visiting such sights as the horseshoe-shaped **Ásbyrgi** canyon and the most powerful waterfall in Europe, **Dettifoss**. End the day by bathing in the relaxing geothermal waters of the **Mývatn Nature Baths**, where you can experience the soft glow of the midnight sun.

Spend the night in the Lake Mývatn area.

Attractions: Ásbyrgi, Dettifoss, Húsavík, Jökulsárgljúfur National Park, Lake Mývatn, Mývatn Nature Baths

DAY
25

DAY 25: EXPLORE NORTH ICELAND

Spend the first half of the day around **Lake Mývatn**. We recommend a visit to **Goðafoss** (The Waterfall of the Gods) on your way to the charming town of Akureyri, where you will find interesting shops and museums as well as a beautiful botanical garden.

After your break in **Akureyri**, you can either head straight to **Skagafjörður** or take a detour on the way to Tröllaskagi (The Peninsula of the Trolls), where you can enjoy fantastic scenery of beautiful mountains, cliffs and fjords. Next, continue through **Siglufjörður**, which was once the centre of Iceland's herring fleet, and make a stop at **Hofsós** to relax in the thermal pool (optional) before arriving at Skagafjörður, an area known for its abundance of purebred Icelandic horses.

Spend the night in Northwest Iceland.

Driving distance approx. 301 km / 187 mi.

Attractions: Akureyri, Goðafoss, Hofsós, Hólar í Hjaltadal, Hrísey, Lake Mývatn, Siglufjörður, Skagafjörður

DAY
26

DAY 26: JOURNEY TO SNÆFELLSNES

Head to the Snæfellsnes Peninsula today. On the way you'll see the curious mounds of **Vatnsdalshólar** and the beautiful **Þingeyrakirkja** church. You can also make stops at the living museum at **Eiríksstaðir**, home of famous Viking Erik the Red, and the hot geothermal pool of **Guðrúnarlaug**, or pay a visit to Stykkishólmur, a picture-perfect fishing village overlooking Breiðafjörður Bay. Here, you can take a walk up to the small hill overlooking the harbour, Súgandisey, for a wonderful panoramic view over the town, sea and surrounding mountains.

Spend the night on Snæfellsnes Peninsula / Borgarfjörður area.

Driving distance approx. 335 km / 208 mi.

Attractions: Eiríksstaðir, Guðrúnarlaug, Kirkjufell, Snæfellsjökull National Park, Snæfellsnes peninsula, Vatnsdalshólar, Þingeyrakirkja

DAY
27

DAY 27: SPECTACULAR SNÆFELLSJÖKULL NATIONAL PARK

Experience the unique **Snæfellsjökull National Park**, with amazing birdlife, lush valleys and lava fields. It is ideal to drive around the peninsula, exploring **Dritvík** Cove, **Lóndrangar** Cliffs as well as **Hellnar** and **Arnarstapi** cliffs with its bursting bird-life and the small villages along the coast. You might also wish to test your strength at the large stones of the black volcanic beach of Djúpalónssandur like the sailors did in the old days.

Spend the night in Reykjavík.

Driving distance approx. 219 km / 136 mi.

Attractions: Arnarstapi, Djúpalónssandur, Dritvík Cove, Hellnar, Lóndrangar, Snæfellsjökull National Park

DAY 28: DEPARTURE FROM ICELAND

On your day of departure, a shuttle bus will collect you from your hotel in **Reykjavík** and deliver you to Keflavík International Airport ahead of your scheduled flight.

If your flight is in the afternoon, you can fit in a relaxing visit to the Blue Lagoon or even take a short guided tour of the volcanic Reykjanes Peninsula (optional; not included).

Attractions: Reykjavík
